# David

David was king of Israel after the first king Saul

Saul

- Reigned 42 years
- was rejected by God  
He did not follow God's instruction – the Amalekites  
He usurped the role of the priest – did the sacrifice before Samuel came

## *Why did God choose David?*

1Sam 16:[7] But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for **the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart.**

## *David's attributes*

- David was a man after God's own heart
- He demonstrated his great faith in God by killing Goliath

- He did not usurp the priestly role
- He was devoted to God and did not turn after other gods



## *David's achievements*

- David conquered / defeated the enemies of Israel.
- He expanded the geographical boundaries of Israel / established boundaries.
- He captured Jerusalem from the Jebusites.
- He made Jerusalem the capital city of Israel.
- He made Jerusalem a religious centre by bringing the ark of the covenant there.
- He made peace treaties with his neighbors / Diplomatic ties / trade links
- He composed psalms used during worship.
- He united the 12 tribes of Israel.
- He made preparations for the construction of the Temple.

## *David's failures*

- He sinned but repented of his sins
- He committed adultery and murder – Bathsheba the wife of Uriah

Even though he sinned God established a covenant with David.

## **2 Sam.5**

### *David is established as King.*

[1] Then came all the tribes of Israel to David unto Hebron, and spake, saying, Behold, we are thy bone and thy flesh.

[2] Also in time past, when Saul was king over us, thou wast he that leddest out and broughtest in Israel: and the LORD said to thee, Thou shalt feed my people Israel, and thou shalt be a captain over Israel.

[3] So all the elders of Israel came to the king to Hebron; and king David made a league with them in Hebron before the LORD: and they anointed David king over Israel.

[4] David was thirty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned forty years.

[5] In Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months: and in Jerusalem he reigned thirty and three years over all Israel and Judah.

[6] And the king and his men went to Jerusalem



unto the Jebusites, the inhabitants of the land: which spake unto David, saying, **Except thou take away the blind and the lame**, thou shalt not come in hither: thinking, David cannot come in hither.

[7] Nevertheless David took the strong hold of Zion: the same is the city of David.

[8] And David said on that day, **Whosoever getteth up to the gutter, and smiteth the Jebusites, and the lame and the blind, that are hated of David's soul, he shall be chief and captain.** (1Chron. 11:6)

Wherefore they said, The blind and the lame shall not come into the house.

**Matt 11:[3] And said unto him, Art thou he that should come, or do we look for another?**

**[4] Jesus answered and said unto them, Go and shew John again those things which ye do hear and see:**

**[5] The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the**

**poor have the gospel preached to them.**  
**[6] And blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in me.**



[9] So David dwelt in the fort, and called it the city of David. And David built round about from Millo and inward.

[10] And David went on, and grew great, and the LORD God of hosts was with him.

[11] And Hiram king of Tyre sent messengers to David, and cedar trees, and carpenters, and masons: and they built David an house.

[12] And David perceived that the LORD had established him king over Israel, and that he had exalted his kingdom for his people Israel's sake.



## 2 Sam.7 *David's house established forever*

[11] And as since the time that I commanded judges to be over my people Israel, and have caused thee to rest from all thine enemies. Also the LORD telleth thee that he will make thee an house.

[12] And when thy days be fulfilled, and thou shalt sleep with thy fathers, I will set up thy seed after thee, which shall proceed out of thy bowels, and I will establish his kingdom.

[13] He shall build an house for my name, and I will stablish the throne of his kingdom for ever.

[14] I will be his father, and he shall be my son. If he commit iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men, and with the stripes of the children of men:

[15] But my mercy shall not depart away from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away before thee.

[16] And thine house and thy kingdom shall be established for ever before thee: thy throne shall be established for ever.

# Goliath

Who was Goliath

the most **well known** giant in the Bible. described as 'a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, his height was six cubits and a span - 2.97 metres

1 Sam 17:

## *David slays Goliath*

[32] And David said to Saul, Let no man's heart fail because of him; thy servant will go and fight with this Philistine.

[33] And Saul said to David, Thou art not able to go against this Philistine to fight with him: for thou art but a youth, and he a man of war from his youth.

[34] And David said unto Saul, Thy servant kept his father's sheep, and there came a lion, and a bear, and took a lamb out of the flock:

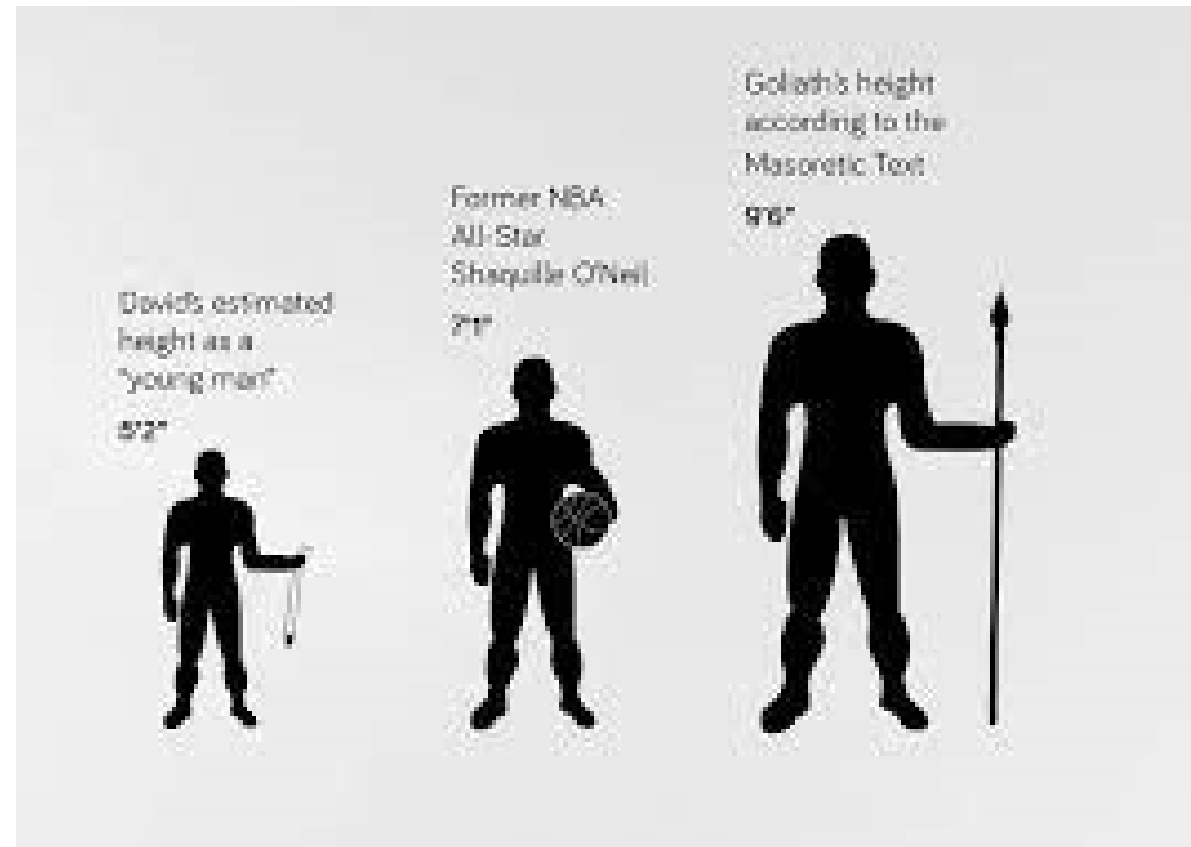

[36] Thy servant slew both the lion and the bear: and this uncircumcised Philistine shall

be as one of them, seeing **he hath defied the armies of the living God.**

[37] David said moreover, The LORD that delivered me out of the paw of the lion, and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine. And Saul said unto David, Go, and the LORD be with thee.

...



[40] And he took his staff in his hand, and chose him five smooth stones out of the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag which he had, even in a scrip; and his sling was in his hand: and he drew near to the Philistine.

[41] And the Philistine came on and drew near unto David; and the man that bare the shield went before him.

[42] And when the Philistine looked about, and saw David, he disdained him: for he was but a youth, and ruddy, and of a fair countenance.

[43] And the Philistine said unto David, Am I a dog, that thou comest to me with staves? And the Philistine cursed David by his gods.

[44] And the Philistine said to David, Come to me, and I will give thy flesh unto the fowls of the air, and to the beasts of the field.

[45] Then said David to the Philistine, **Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied.**

[46] This day will the LORD deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee, and take thine head from thee; and I will give the carcases of the

host of the Philistines this day unto the fowls of the air, and to the wild beasts of the earth; that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel.

[47] And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: **for the battle is the LORD's**, and he will give you into our hands.

[48] And it came to pass, when the Philistine arose, and came and drew nigh to meet David, that David hasted, and ran toward the army to meet the Philistine.

[49] And David put his hand in his bag, and took thence a stone, and slang it, and smote the Philistine in his forehead, that the stone sunk into his forehead; and he fell upon his face to the earth.

[50] So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and with a stone, and smote the Philistine, and slew him; but there was no sword in the hand of David.



# Solomon

Son of Bathsheba

The achievements of Solomon

- Solomon built a magnificent temple for God
- brought the ark of the covenant to the temple
- He promoted trade with neighbouring countries
- had a navy of merchant ships.
- He initiated a building programme
- fortified the city of Jerusalem
- He reorganized the country into districts for effective administration
- He established good diplomatic relationships with other nations through inter marriages
- He settled disputes among people wisely
- He composed proverbs / songs
- He initiated industrial activities within the Kingdom / exploited copper mines at Edom
- He established a strong army for defence.



## 1 Kings 1

### *Solomon is pronounced as King*

[24] And Nathan said, My lord, O king, hast thou said, Adonijah shall reign after me, and he shall sit upon my throne?

[25] For he is gone down this day, and hath slain oxen and fat cattle and sheep in abundance, and hath called all the king's sons, and the captains of the host, and Abiathar the priest; and, behold, they eat and drink before him, and say, God save king Adonijah.

[26] But me, even me thy servant, and Zadok the priest, and Benaiah the son of Jehoiada, and thy servant Solomon, hath he not called.

[27] Is this thing done by my lord the king, and thou hast not shewed it unto thy servant, who should sit on the throne of my lord the king after him?

[28] **Then king David answered and said,** Call me Bath-sheba. And she came into the king's presence, and stood before the king.

[29] And the king sware, and said, As the LORD

liveth, that hath redeemed my soul out of all distress,

[30] **Even as I swear unto thee by the LORD God of Israel, saying, Assuredly Solomon thy son shall reign after me, and he shall sit upon my throne in my stead; even so will I certainly do this day.**

## 1Kings 3:

### *Solomon is blessed and receives great wisdom*

[5] In Gibeon the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night: and God said, Ask what I shall give thee.

[6] And Solomon said, Thou hast shewed unto thy servant David my father great mercy, according as he walked before thee in truth, and in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart with thee; and thou hast kept for him this great kindness, that thou hast given him a son to sit on his throne, as it is this day.

[7] And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made



thy servant king instead of David my father: and I am but a little child: I know not how to go out or come in.

[8] And thy servant is in the midst of thy people which thou hast chosen, a great people, that cannot be numbered nor counted for multitude.

[9] Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people?

[10] And the speech pleased the Lord, that Solomon had asked this thing.

[11] And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment;

[12] Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee.

[13] And I have also given thee that which thou hast not asked, both riches, and honour: so that

there shall not be any among the kings like unto thee all thy days.

[14] And if thou wilt walk in my ways, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as thy father David did walk, then I will lengthen thy days.

# The Davidic Covenant

So far we have seen....

## *The Edenic Covenant between God and Mankind*

Gen 1:[28] And God blessed them, and God said unto them, **Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it:** and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

[29] And God said, **Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.**

[30] And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given

every green herb for meat: and it was so.

## *The Noahic covenant between God and all living creatures*

Gen 9: [1] And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, **Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth.**

[2] And the fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth, and upon every fowl of the air, upon all that moveth upon the earth, and upon all the fishes of the sea; into your hand are they delivered.

[3] **Every moving thing that liveth shall be meat for you; even as the green herb have I given you all things.**

[4] **But flesh with the life thereof, which is the blood thereof, shall ye not eat.**



## *The Abrahamic Covenant between God and Abraham and his seed*

Gen 12: [1] Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

[2] And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:

[3] And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

## *The Mosaic Covenant between God and Moses and the Israelite people*

Deut 11: [13] And it shall come to pass, if ye shall hearken diligently unto my commandments which I command you this day, to love the LORD your God, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul,

[14] That I will give you the rain of your land in his due season, the first rain and the latter rain, that thou mayest gather in thy corn, and thy wine, and thine oil.



## *The Davidic Covenant between God and David to establish his dynasty forever*

1 Chr 17: [11] And it shall come to pass, when thy days be expired that thou must go to be with thy fathers, that **I will raise up thy seed after thee, which shall be of thy sons; and I will establish his kingdom.**

**[12] He shall build me an house, and I will stablsh his throne for ever.**

[13] I will be his father, and he shall be my son: and I will not take my mercy away from him, as I took it from him that was before thee:

[14] But I will settle him in mine house and in my kingdom for ever: and his throne shall be established for evermore.

## *The New Covenant*

**Jer 30:[31]** Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah:

**[32]** Not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers in the day that I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt; which my covenant they brake, although I was an husband unto them, saith the LORD:

**[33]** But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel; After those days, saith the LORD, I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts; and will be their God, and they shall be my people.

**[34]** And they shall teach no more every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the LORD: for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them, saith the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.

**Romans 11:[26]** And so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob:

**[27]** For this is my covenant unto them, when I shall take away their sins.

## *Jesus the mediator of the New Covenant*

**Heb 8: [6]** But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises.

**[7]** For if that first covenant had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second.
