

Joseph of Arimathaea

- The story of Joseph of Arimathaea
- Joseph of Arimathaea was a wealthy Jewish man who buried the body of Jesus after the crucifixion.
- there are many legends about him, including
 - that he visited Britain with the young Jesus
 - that after the crucifixion he brought the holy grail to Glastonbury in Somerset and
 - established the first Christian church there.

Was Joseph Related To Jesus?

Luke 23:[50] And, behold, there was a man named Joseph, a counseller;

and he was a good man, and a just:
[51] (the same had not consented to
the counsel and deed of them;) he was
of Arimathaea, a city of the Jews: who
also himself waited for the kingdom
of god.

[52] This man went unto Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus.

[53] And he took it down, and wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a sepulchre that was hewn in stone, wherein never man before was laid.

The senior male relative of a crucified person was obliged to deal with the body.

- Jesus' father was no longer around
- Joseph did volunteer for the task
- suggests he may have been related to Jesus.

Arimathaea



There are varying opinions of its location

- Thought to have been born here
- Otherwise called Ramah
 - birth place of Samuel the prophet, who here lived and died, and was buried.

Family and early life

- Born about eight years before Jesus
- Noble with a great reputation in Jerusalem
- Highly commended for his righteousness
- Very scholarly
- The high priests and principal men of the city came then frequently to know his opinion about the accurate understanding of points of the law

Religion


- At seventeen years old studied the three sects of the Jews
 - o Pharisees-Sadducees-Essenes
- Became a pharisees dedicating himself to austerities and labour
 - Did not follow the vices of the pharisees
 - Not hypocritical, just in all his dealings
 - Very charitable in private
- Became a sincere convert of Jesus
 - Followed Him through Judea and Galilee

Joseph The Tin Man - Nobilis Decurio

- Had extraordinary political and business ability
- One of the wealthiest men in the world of that time.
- Controlling the tin and lead industry (equivalent to steel today)
 - Had vast holdings in the famous, ancient tin mines of Britain.
 - Owned one of the largest private merchant shipping fleets afloat
 - The Latin Vulgate -Mark 15:43,
 and Luke 23:50, refers to Joseph
 of Arimathaea as 'Decurio'.
 - common roman term for an official in charge of metal mines.

- Tin the main metal for making alloys
 - In great demand by the warring Romans.
 - A major portion the world's of tin was mined in Cornwall,
 - Smelted into ingots and exported throughout the then known civilized world,





Early visits to England with the young Jesus

A legend of early English Christianity is that Joseph of Arimathaea visited the west country of England with the teenage Jesus.

Both Somerset and Cornwall claim to have been visited by Joseph and Jesus.

The poem by William Blake is based on the same legend, and was set to music by Sir Hubert Parry as 'Jerusalem':

And did those feet in ancient time Walk upon England's mountains green? And was the Holy Lamb of God On England's pleasant pastures seen? And did the countenance divine Shine forth upon our clouded hills? And was Jerusalem builded here among those dark satanic mills?

Joseph and the Sanhedrin

- an influential member of the Sanhedrin,
- a legislative member of a provincial roman senate.
- had a high financial and social standing
- he owned a palatial home in the holy city
- and a fine country residence just outside Jerusalem
- was well placed to beg the body of Jesus from Pilate

Exodus To Britain

- the Sanhedrin wanted to get rid of joseph
- he and 12 others were disposed of...
- Historian of the Roman Catholic Church and Curator of the famous Vatican library, ,Cardinal Baronius, writes.

'in that year (36 AD) the party mentioned was exposed to the sea in a vessel without sails or oars. The vessel drifted finally to Marseilles and they were saved. From Marseilles Joseph and his company passed into Britain and after preaching the gospel there, died.'

"...reaching its shores the illustrious band sailed up the waterway of the west, the Severn sea, until they came within sight of a lofty green hill, as Dean Alford writes, 'most like to Tabor's Holy Mount', known to this day as Glastonbury tor. They made their way up the estuary of the Brue and the Parrot, arriving at a cluster of islands about twelve miles inland from the coast. The most inspiring of these was the 'sacred isle of Avalon', its shores sheltered in apple orchards. "




Arrival At Glastonbury (Avalon)

- following their disembarkation, the travellers made their way up the hill
- Joseph, weary from his travel, stopped to

rest, thrusting his staff into the ground.

- tradition says the staff became part of the earth, taking root, and in time blossomed
- historically known as the 'holy thorn'.
- from ancient times it is referred to as a phenomenon of nature
- the only thorn tree in the world to bloom at Christmas time and in May.
- still bears the name Weary All Hill'

Glastonbury Thorn

There is a custom of sending a budded branch of the Glastonbury thorn to the queen at Christmas.

At the time of the adoption of the revised Gregorian calendar in Britain in 1752, the gentleman's magazine reported that curious visitors went to see whether the Glastonbury thorn kept to the Julian calendar or the new one:

'Glastonbury.-a vast concourse of people attended the noted thorn on Christmasday, new style; but, to their great disappointment, there was no appearance of its blowing, which made them watch it narrowly the 5th of January, the Christmas-day, old style, when it blowed as usual.'

The Apostle Thomas

One of the 12 disciples

Also known as Thomas Didymus (meaning twin)

Best known for his statement of doubt about Jesus being alive after his crucifixion:

"Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe." John20:25



Showed his dedication to
Jesus when Jesus was going to
raise Lazarus from the dead.


"[16] Then said Thomas, which is called Didymus, unto his fellowdisciples, Let us also go, that we may die with him." John20:25

One of the most important conversations recorded was between Thomas and Jesus

- "[3] And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.
- [4] And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know.
- [5] Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way?
- [6] Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.
- [7] If ye had known me, ye should have known my Father also: and from henceforth ve know him. and have seen him." **John.14**

 - Oldest copy 145AD
 - First published in 1956
- Apocalypse of Thomas
 - From the New Testament apocrypha



Travels of Thomas

- Thomas travelled to the Malibar Coast of India
 - The Greeks had discovered how to sail directly from the Middle East to India
 - Would have taken around 40 days during the monsoon



- Roman coins have been found dating to this time
- There was a Jewish synagogue there
- Important trade centre on the spice coast

- There are still Christian churches today where people regard themselves as St Thomas's Christians
 - o in their liturgy they use forms and a
 - o language (Syriac) that were derived from Mesopotamia and Persia
- Established 7 churches
- Spent 20 years preaching the gospel here
- Documentary evidence burnt by the Portuguese when Vasco de Gama discovered the sea route to the spice
 - They considered them to be heretics and burnt their books




Travels of Thomas

- When persecution increased, he headed to the East Coast towards Madras
- Spend 4 years in Mylapore
- Debating with the Brahmans
- Refused to worship the Hindu gods
- Stabbed by Soldiers and died 8 miles from Madras
- Buried at Mylapore after 30 years in India

Isaiah 53

[1] Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed? [2] For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. [3] He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not. [4] Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. [5] But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

[6] All we like sheep have gone astray; we

- have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- [7] He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.
- [8] He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken.
- [9] And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth.
- [10] Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall

see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

[11] He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities.

[12] Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors

Hebrews 12

[1] Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,

[2] Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

[3] For consider him that endured such

contradiction of sinners against himself, lest

[4] Ye have not yet resisted unto blood, striving against sin.

ye be wearied and faint in your minds.

- [11] Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.
- [12] Wherefore lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees;
- [13] And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed.
- [14] Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:
- [15] Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled;
- [16] Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright.
- [17] For ye know how that afterward, when

he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears.

[18] For ye are not come unto the mount that might be touched, and that burned with fire, nor unto blackness, and darkness, and tempest,

[19] And the sound of a trumpet, and the voice of words; which voice they that heard intreated that the word should not be spoken to them any more:

[20] (For they could not endure that which was commanded, And if so much as a beast touch the mountain, it shall be stoned, or thrust through with a dart:

[21] And so terrible was the sight, thatMoses said, I exceedingly fear and quake:)[22] But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company

of angels,

[23] To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect, [24] And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel. [25] See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more shall not we escape, if we turn away from him that speaketh from heaven:

[26] Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven.

[27] And this word, Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may

remain.

[28] Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:

[29] For our God is a consuming fire.
