The Shofar

Hosea 8:1 Set the trumpet to thy mouth. He shall come as an eagle against the house of the LORD, because they have transgressed my covenant, and trespassed against my law.

Zechariah 9:14 the LORD GOD shall blow the trumpet, and shall go with whirlwinds of the south.



What is a Shofar & when is it used

- A shofar is an instrument made from the horn of a ram or other kosher animal.
- It was used in ancient Israel to announce
 - the New Moon (Rosh Chodesh) and call people together.
 - It was also blown on Rosh Hashanah, marking the beginning of the New Year, signifying both need to wake up to the call to repentance, and
 - in connection with the portion read on the second day of Rosh Hashanah, the Binding of Isaac (Genesis, chapter 22) in which Abraham sacrifices a ram in place of his son, Isaac.

The Shofar

• SHOFAR - Hebrew for a trumpet made from a ram's horn.

Gideon Judges 7

- Gideon's 300 to do battle with a heavily armed enemy that numbered many thousands.
- He instructed Gideon to go out with a pitcher and torch in one hand, and a SHOFAR in the other hand.
- At the appointed time, the 300 blew their SHOFARS in unity,
- which firstly caused a restlessness in the camp of the enemy,
- caused total confusion to the point of them turning on each other and killing each other with their swords.

Battle of Jericho Joshua 6:1-26

- seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams' horns
- the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets.
- when they make a long blast with the ram's horn, and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat

Going to War Num. 10:9

 "And when you go to war in your land against the adversary who attacks you, then you shall sound an alarm with the SHOFARS, that you may be remembered before the Lord your God, and be saved from your enemies."

Heralds the Day of the Lord - Joel 2:1

 Blow ye the trumpet in Zion, and sound an alarm in my holy mountain: let all the inhabitants of the land tremble: for the day of the LORD cometh, for it is nigh at hand

Announce the 2nd Coming of Messiah - 1 Thessalonians 4:16

- For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:
- Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.
- Wherefore comfort one another with these words.

- Blown before the dead rise 1 Corinthians 15:52
- Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed,
- In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.
- For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.

THE FEAST OF TRUMPETS

- The Feast of Trumpets
 - fell on the first day of the seventh month,
 - announced the last three annual feasts of
 - Trumpets or Rosh Hashanah , (6th September 2021)
 - The Day of Atonement or Yom Kippur (16th September 2021)
 - Tabernacles or Sukkot or Feast of Booths (21st September 2021)
- Still celebrated by the Jews as Rosh Hashanah,
 - literally meaning "Head of the Year."
 - The Jews still observe Rosh Hashanah as their New Year
 - it marks the beginning of what is alternatively called the "Ten Days of Repentance," or the "Days of Awe."
 - the ten days of preparation for the Day of Atonement

Blowing the Shofar

THE TEKIAH SOUND

• the long, straight shofar blast -- is the sound of the King's coronation.

THE SHEVARIM SOUND

three medium, wailing blasts -- is the sobbing cry of a Jewish heart
-- yearning to connect, to grow, to achieve, pray from the bottom
of your heart and ask God for the ability to become great

THE TERUAH SOUND

 9 quick blasts in short succession -- resembles an alarm clock, arousing us from our spiritual slumber
