



## Who was Samuel?

- Born about 1171BC
- Kohathite (Levites) Parents
  - Elkanah & Hannah
- Was a gift from God
  - Hannah was barren until she promised her son to the Lord's service
- Kept at least part of the Nazarite vow all his life (did not cut his hair)
- Came to live at the Temple while still a young child
- Lived in Israel's tribal confederation
- Heard the voice of God in the night
- Was told of the downfall of Eli's house
- Was a parson on a wallaby
- Had two sons - Joel & Abiah - which did not follow in his footsteps
- Anointed the first God ordained King of Israel - Saul
- Anointed the second God ordained King of Israel – David – after the disobedience of Saul



## 1 Samuel 8

And it came to pass, when Samuel was old, that he made his sons judges over Israel.

<sup>2</sup> Now the name of his firstborn was Joel; and the name of his second, Abiah: they were judges in Beersheba.

<sup>3</sup> **And his sons walked not in his ways, but turned aside after lucre, and took bribes, and perverted judgment.**

<sup>4</sup> Then all the elders of Israel gathered themselves together, and came to Samuel unto Ramah,

<sup>5</sup> And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations.

<sup>6</sup> But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the Lord.

<sup>7</sup> And the Lord said unto Samuel, **Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.**

<sup>8</sup> According to all the works which they have done since the day that I brought them up out of Egypt even unto this day, wherewith they have

forsaken me, and served other gods, so do they also unto thee.



<sup>9</sup> Now therefore hearken unto their voice:  
howbeit yet protest solemnly unto them, and  
shew them the manner of the king that shall reign  
over them.

<sup>10</sup> And Samuel told all the words of the Lord unto  
the people that asked of him a king.

<sup>19</sup> Nevertheless the people refused to obey the  
voice of Samuel; and they said, **Nay; but we will  
have a king over us;**

<sup>20</sup> **That we also may be like all the nations; and  
that our king may judge us, and go out before us,  
and fight our battles.**

<sup>21</sup> And Samuel heard all the words of the people,  
and he rehearsed them in the ears of the Lord.

<sup>22</sup> And the Lord said to Samuel, Hearken unto  
their voice, and make them a king. And Samuel  
said unto the men of Israel, Go ye every man  
unto his city.

*Judges 17:6*

*<sup>6</sup> In those days there was no king in Israel, but every  
man did that which was right in his own eyes.*

## 1 Samuel 12

### Vindication

And Samuel said unto all Israel, Behold, I have hearkened unto your voice in all that ye said unto me, and have made a king over you.

<sup>2</sup> And now, behold, the king walketh before you: and I am old and grayheaded; and, behold, my sons are with you: and I have walked before you from my childhood unto this day.

<sup>3</sup> Behold, here I am: witness against me before the LORD, and before his anointed: whose ox have I taken? or whose ass have I taken? or whom have I defrauded? whom have I oppressed? or of whose hand have I received any bribe to blind mine eyes therewith? and I will restore it you.

<sup>4</sup> And they said, **Thou hast not defrauded us, nor oppressed us, neither hast thou taken ought of any man's hand.**

<sup>5</sup> And he said unto them, The LORD is witness against you, and his anointed is witness this day, that ye have not found ought in my hand. And they answered, He is witness.

### Warning

<sup>6</sup> And Samuel said unto the people, It is the LORD that advanced Moses and Aaron, and that brought your fathers up out of the land of Egypt.

<sup>7</sup> Now therefore stand still, that I may reason with you before the LORD of all the righteous acts of the LORD, which he did to you and to your fathers.

<sup>8</sup> When Jacob was come into Egypt, and your fathers cried unto the LORD, then the LORD sent Moses and Aaron, which brought forth your fathers out of Egypt, and made them dwell in this place.

<sup>9</sup> And when they forgot the LORD their God, he sold them into the hand of Sisera, captain of the host of Hazor, and into the hand of the Philistines, and into the hand of the king of Moab, and they fought against them.

<sup>10</sup> And they cried unto the LORD, and said, We have sinned, because we have forsaken the LORD, and have served Baalim and Ashtaroth: but now deliver us out of the hand of our enemies, and we will serve thee.

<sup>11</sup> And the LORD sent Jerubbaal, and Bedan, and Jephthah, and Samuel, and delivered you out of the hand of your enemies on every side, and ye dwelled safe.

<sup>12</sup> And when ye saw that Nahash the king of the children of Ammon came against you, ye said unto me, Nay; but a king shall reign over us: when the LORD your God was your king.

<sup>13</sup> Now therefore behold the king whom ye have chosen, and whom ye have desired! and, behold, the LORD hath set a king over you.

<sup>14</sup> If ye will fear the LORD, and serve him, and obey his voice, and not rebel against the commandment of the LORD, then shall both ye and also the king that reigneth over you continue following the LORD your God:

<sup>15</sup> But if ye will not obey the voice of the LORD, but rebel against the commandment of the LORD, then shall the hand of the LORD be against you, as it was against your fathers.

*Bedan - "the son of Dan" – Samson?*

*Referenced event in 1 Samuel 11 where Saul delivers the people*

## John 18:33-38

<sup>33</sup> Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again, and called Jesus, and said unto him, Art thou the King of the Jews?

<sup>34</sup> Jesus answered him, Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or did others tell it thee of me?

<sup>35</sup> Pilate answered, Am I a Jew? Thine own nation and the chief priests have delivered thee unto me: what hast thou done?

<sup>36</sup> Jesus answered, My kingdom is not of this world: if my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence.

<sup>37</sup> Pilate therefore said unto him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, **Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice.**

<sup>38</sup> Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no fault at all.

## John 19:7-9,12,14-15

<sup>7</sup> The Jews answered him, We have a law, and by our law he ought to die, because he made himself the Son of God.

<sup>8</sup> When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he was the more afraid;

<sup>9</sup> And went again into the judgment hall, and saith unto Jesus, Whence art thou? But Jesus gave him no answer.

<sup>12</sup> And from thenceforth Pilate sought to release him: but the Jews cried out, saying, If thou let this man go, thou art not Caesar's friend: whosoever maketh himself a king speaketh against Caesar.

<sup>14</sup> And it was the preparation of the passover, and about the sixth hour: and he saith unto the Jews, Behold your King!

<sup>15</sup> But they cried out, Away with him, away with him, crucify him. Pilate saith unto them, **Shall I crucify your King?** The chief priests answered, **We have no king but Caesar.**
