

- We are also looking at the wedding feast or 'P'-party where Jesus performed his first recorded miracle.

Mephibosheth – Jonathan's son

- After 17 years David has established his kingdom. He remembers his friend, Jonathan and wants to find a remnant of his family.
- He finds
 Mephibosheth who was
 injured and became lame
 when he was 5, while
 fleeing after Saul and
 Jonathan died in battle.
- David shows grace to Mephibosheth restores his lands & provides him full support from then on.
- Later Mephibosheth does not support David


in his fight against Absolom but is forgiven anyway.

But what of Mephibosheth; what happened to him? Well, we lose track of him in the Bible account for many years, but it seems that the few survivors of King Saul's court went to live in a place called Lo Debar, near to where Mephibosheth's uncle, Ish-Bosheth, who had been killed by David's men, had lived in Mahanaim. Lo Debar was a bit of a ghetto town, its name meaning 'no thing', 'no place', or 'no pasture'. This is where Mephibosheth would have grown up. There has been some speculation linking the meaning of the name of the place where Mephibosheth lived, and his own disability, which culturally would have left him being in a lowly position... 'no thing'.

Wedding Party at Cana

- After he returned from Egypt Jesus grew up in Nazareth.
- John says he is baptized in Bethabara about 40km away from Nazareth.
- This takes place just a few days before the wedding at Cana.



- Jesus has only gathered 4 of his disciples by this stage.
- When he says he is not yet ready to start his mission it was true.
- Jesus' mother had absolute faith in the divine power her son had.

2 Samuel 2:4 and 9:5-13

^{2:4} And Jonathan, Saul's son, had a son that was lame of his feet. He was five years old when the tidings came of Saul and Jonathan out of Jezreel, and his nurse took him up, and fled: and it came to pass, as she made haste to flee, that he fell, and became lame. And his name was Mephibosheth.

^{9:5}Then king David sent, and fetched him out of the house of Machir, the son of Ammiel, from Lodebar.

⁶ Now when Mephibosheth, the son of Jonathan, the son of Saul, was come unto David, he fell on

his face, and did reverence. And David said, Mephibosheth. And he answered, Behold thy servant!

⁷ And David said unto him, Fear not: for I will surely shew thee kindness for Jonathan thy father's sake, and will restore thee all the land of Saul thy father; and thou shalt eat bread at my table continually.

⁸ And he bowed himself, and said, What is thy servant, that thou shouldest look upon such a dead dog as I am?

⁹ Then the king called to Ziba, Saul's servant, and said unto him, I have given unto thy master's son all that pertained to Saul and to all his house.

¹⁰ Thou therefore, and thy sons, and thy servants, shall till the land for him, and thou shalt bring in the fruits, that thy master's son may have food to eat: but Mephibosheth thy master's son shall eat bread alway at my table. Now Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants.

¹¹ Then said Ziba unto the king, According to all that my lord the king hath commanded his servant, so shall thy servant do. As for Mephibosheth, said the king, he shall eat at my table, as one of the king's sons.

- ¹² And Mephibosheth had a young son, whose name was Micha. And all that dwelt in the house of Ziba were servants unto Mephibosheth.
- ¹³ So Mephibosheth dwelt in Jerusalem: for he did eat continually at the king's table; and was lame on both his feet.
