Revelation Chapter 17

the judgement of the great whore finished

[1] And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory.

Ezekiel 43: [2] And, behold, the glory of the God of Israel came from the way of the east: and his voice was like a noise of many waters: and the earth shined with his glory.

[2] And he cried mightily with a strong voice, saying, Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird.

The nations are mad

[3] For all nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, and the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her, and the merchants of the earth are waxed rich through the abundance of her delicacies.

Jeremiah 51:[7] Babylon hath been a golden cup in the LORD's hand, that made all the earth drunken: the nations have drunken of her wine; therefore the nations are mad.

God's people told to come away

[4] And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.

Isaiah 52: [11] Depart ye, depart ye, go ye out from thence, touch no unclean thing; go ye out of the midst of her; be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the LORD.

[9] But these two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood: they shall come upon thee in their perfection for the multitude of thy sorceries, and for the great abundance of thine enchantments.

[11] Therefore shall evil come upon thee; thou shalt not know from whence it riseth: and mischief shall fall upon thee; thou shalt not be able to put it off: and desolation shall come upon thee suddenly, which thou shalt not know.

- [10] Who died for us, that, whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with him.

What we should do for 'the church'

- [11] Wherefore comfort yourselves together, and edify one another, even as also ye do.
- [12] And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you;
- [13] And to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. And be at peace among yourselves.

What we should do for others

[14] Now we exhort you, brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feebleminded, support the weak, be patient toward all men.

[15] See that none render evil for evil unto any man; but ever follow that which is good, [27] I charge you by the Lord that this epistle both among yourselves, and to all men.

What we should do for our own conduct

- [16] Rejoice evermore.
- [17] Pray without ceasing.
- [18] In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.
- [19] Quench not the Spirit.
- [20] Despise not prophesyings.
- [21] Prove all things; hold fast that which is good.
- [22] Abstain from all appearance of evil.

[23] And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and

soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

[24] Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it.

[25] Brethren, pray for us.

[26] Greet all the brethren with an holy kiss.
