Paul

Quick Facts:

Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee;

Philippians 3:5

- Like King Saul – Saul/Paul was a Benjamite
- Was born in Tarsus (bwn. 5BC & 5AD)
- Schooled in Jerusalem under Gamaliel
- Is the dominant Character in the book of Acts
- Wrote 14 of the 27 Books of the New Testament
- Embarked on 3 major Missionary Journeys
- Escorted under a guard of 470 soldiers for protection while in custody
- Held captive for 8 years and transferred to Rome (4th Journey?) awaiting appeal to Caesar
- He was a Roman Citizen
- He was a Tent Maker by trade
- Had some family in Jerusalem
- Never Married
- Targeted much of his ministry towards Gentile converts
- Travelled 14,725 km in 14 years
- Preached to King Agrippa, Governor Felix and Governor Fetus
- Martyred approx. 65AD

Are they ministers of Christ? (I speak as a fool) I am more; in labours more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequent, in deaths oft.

Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one.

Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren;

In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness.

2 Corinthians 11:23-27

As for Saul, he made havock of the church, entering into every house, and haling men and women committed them to prison. **Acts 8:3**

Saul to Paul

Early Life

- A Jew, born in Tarsus, a city in Cilicia **Acts 22:3**
- Schooled in Jerusalem under Gamaliel **Acts 22:3**

Pre-Conversion (In Jerusalem)

- Stoning of Stephen **Acts 7:58**
- Raids on Christian houses to arrest believers **Acts 8:3**

Pre-Conversion (Expanding to Damascus)

- Obtains orders from High Priest to arrest Christians at Damascus **Acts 9:1-2**
- Is blinded by a great light and hears the voice of Jesus **Acts 9:3-9**

The Conversion

- Ananias told to go and heal Saul **Acts 9:17-18**
- Saul immediately goes out and Preaches Jesus **Acts 9:20-22**



Starting Out

- Escapes Damascus to avoid a plot to Murder him **Acts 9:23-25**
- Preaches at Jerusalem until his life is in danger. He is then sent home to Tarsus **Acts 9:26-30**

Go thy way: for he is a chosen vessel unto me, to bear my name before the Gentiles, and kings, and the children of Israel: **Acts 9:15**

Saul to Paul

The Return

- Barnabas travels to Tarsus to bring Saul to Antioch following the message being accepted by the Gentiles **Acts 11:25**
- Barnabas and Saul briefly return to Jerusalem to bring aid to the believers there.

Acts 11:30, 12:25

- Paul flees Iconium after the unbelieving Jews and Gentiles plot to Stone him

Acts 14:1-5

- Big trouble at Lystra
 - Paul heals a crippled man **Acts 14:10**
 - Paul & Barnabas mistaken to be gods by the people **Acts 14:12**
 - Paul is stoned and taken for dead **Acts 14:19**

Acts 14:19

The Travels Begin AD.45

- Saul begins his first Journey **Acts 13:2**
- Saul encounters Paul at Salamis and from this point is known by his Roman Name “Paul” **Acts 13:6-12**

Acts 13:6-12

- Barnabas and Paul give up on the Jews at Antioch (Pisidia) and commit to preaching to the Gentiles

Acts 13:46-51

- End their Journey in Derbe and make the return Journey stopping at each body of believers

Acts 14:21-27



The Adventures of Paul

Establishing the Grace based church

- Paul and Barnabas dispute with some Jewish believers who were teaching the need for circumcision to be saved

Acts 15:1-2

- Paul and Barnabas present their success among the Gentiles at the Jerusalem council and the fundamentals for Christian law adherence

Acts 15:12

Journey No.2 AD.53

- Paul begins a second Journey
- Timothy is circumcised (Jewish decent) and joins the team
- Forbidden to stop in Asia but shown in a vision to head to Macedonia

Acts 15:36

Acts 16:3

Acts 16:6,9

Trouble at Philippi Acts 16:16-40

- Paul casts out a diving spirit
- Paul & Silas beaten and imprisoned
- An earthquake breaks up the prison
- The prison guard looks after Paul & Silas and is converted
- Paul & Silas claim their Roman citizenship and are released



The Adventures of Paul

Journey No.2 AD.53 - cont

- In Thessalonica their accommodation is attacked by an angry mob
Acts 17:5
- Paul & Silas are chased out of Berea
Acts 17:14

- In Athens Paul preaches the “Unknown God” on Mars Hill
Acts 17:16-34

- Paul meets Aquila in Corinth and the two work together as TentMakers
Acts 18:1-3



- Paul stays in Corinth for 18 months and then after an attempt is made by Jews to take him to judgement he leaves for Syria
Acts 18:12-18

- Paul takes a Vow (Nazarite?)
Acts 18:18

- Paul stops at Jerusalem and then heads back to Antioch
Acts 18:22

The Adventures of Paul

Journey No.3 AD.56

- Paul makes his way to Ephesus where he stops to teach at the school of “Tyrannus” for 2 years
Acts 19:9

Trouble at Ephesus *Acts 19:23-41*

- Idol crafters realise they will be out of work if Christianity continues to increase
- The people are stirred up and drag Paul’s traveling companions into the amphitheater
- Alexander tries to calm them down but it shouted down for 2 hours
- The town clerk finally dismisses the crowd
- Paul leaves for Macedonia

Some therefore cried one thing, and some another: for the assembly was confused: and the more part knew not wherefore they were come together.
Acts 19:32

- Paul travels in Greece for 3 months
Acts 20:3
- In Troas Paul preaches till midnight and heals Eutychus after he fell asleep and fell from the 3rd floor
Acts 20:7-12
- Paul is frequently told he will be caught if he continues to Jerusalem
Acts 21



The Adventures of Paul

Paul's Imprisonment at Jerusalem

- As Prophesied Paul is set upon at Jerusalem and saved (arrested) by the Roman authorities
Acts 21:28
- Paul addresses the people to make a defence but is drowned out after declaring his mission to the Gentiles
Acts 21:37- 22:23
- Escapes scourging - claiming Roman Citizenship
Acts 22:25
- Faces accusers but uses his pharisee association to break-up the crowd
Acts 23:1-10
- 40 Jews vow to hunger strike until they kill Paul
Acts 23:12-22

Transport and Captivity in Caesarea

- 470 soldiers ordered to transport Paul to the Governor Felix at 9pm
Acts 23:23-35
- Paul testifies before Governor Felix and over a 2-year period shares the Gospel with him
Acts 24
- Paul stands trial before Governor Fetus and fearing an unjust trial appeals to Caesar
Acts 25:1-12
- Paul preaches to King Agrippa and his wife Bernice
Acts 26



The Adventures of Paul

Paul's final Journey

Acts 27-28

- Paul departs by sail to Rome
- Is allow to visit his friends at Sidon
- Prophecies the wreck of the ship
- Preaches I told you so but also prophecies the safety of all lives aboard
- The ship is wrecked on Melita and all make it to land safely on wreckage
- Survives a serpent bite
- Heals the father of the chief of the island and then others
- After 3 months sails to Sicily
- Arrives in Rome and is kept in a hired house from which he preached

The Jerusalem Council

And certain men which came down from Judaea taught the brethren, and said, Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved.

² When therefore Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and disputation with them, they determined that Paul and Barnabas, and certain other of them, should go up to Jerusalem unto the apostles and elders about this question.

⁴ And when they were come to Jerusalem, they were received of the church, and of the apostles and elders, and they declared all things that God had done with them.

⁵ But there rose up certain of the sect of the Pharisees which believed, saying, That it was needful to circumcise them, and to command them to keep the law of Moses.

⁶ And the apostles and elders came together for to consider of this matter.

⁷ And when there had been much disputing, Peter rose up, and said unto them, Men and brethren, ye know how that a good while ago God made choice among us, that the Gentiles by my mouth should hear the word of the gospel, and believe.

⁸ And God, which knoweth the hearts, bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us;

⁹ And put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith.

¹⁰ Now therefore why tempt ye God, to put a yoke upon the neck of the disciples, which neither our fathers nor we were able to bear?

¹¹ But we believe that through the grace of the LORD Jesus Christ we shall be saved, even as they.

¹² Then all the multitude kept silence, and gave audience to Barnabas and Paul, declaring what miracles and wonders God had wrought among the Gentiles by them.

¹³ And after they had held their peace, James answered, saying, Men and brethren, hearken unto me:

¹⁸ Known unto God are all his works from the beginning of the world.

¹⁹ Wherefore my sentence is, that we trouble not them, which from among the Gentiles are turned to God:

²⁰ But that we write unto them, that they abstain from pollutions of idols, and from fornication, and from things strangled, and from blood.

²¹ For Moses of old time hath in every city them that preach him, being read in the synagogues every sabbath day.

Romans 3:1-2

What advantage then hath the Jew? or what profit is there of circumcision?

Much every way: chiefly, because that unto them were committed the oracles of God.

Romans 2:17-18

Behold, thou art called a Jew, and retest in the law, and makest thy boast of God,
And knowest his will, and approvest the things that are more excellent, being instructed out of the law;



The Mercy of the salvation of our souls through faith is by Grace and appeases Gods Justice required for our wrong doing

So what of Israel?

Romans 11:25-26

For I would not, brethren, that ye should be ignorant of this mystery, lest ye should be wise in your own conceits; that blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in.

And so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob:

Romans 11:25-26

And I saw another angel ascending from the east, having the seal of the living God: and he cried with a loud voice to the four angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, Saying, Hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads.

And I heard the number of them which were sealed: and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel.
