The Lords Prayer

- Requested by the Disciples of Jesus.

“And it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.

*² And he said unto them, When ye pray, say,”
Luke 11:1,2*

- Recorded in Matthew 6 and Luke 11.
 - With slight differences

Matthew 6:13

- It is disputed whether this was ever part of the prayer
 - It is missing from the earliest Matthew manuscripts
 - Many of the manuscripts that do include it vary in the wording
 - It is widely understood that the prayer was transmitted orally before being recorded in written form

Original or not it is biblically sound

1 Chronicles 29:10-11

¹⁰ Wherefore David blessed the LORD before all the congregation: and David said, Blessed be thou, LORD God of Israel our father, **for ever and ever**.

¹¹ Thine, O LORD is the greatness, **and the power, and the glory**, and the victory, and the majesty: for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine; **thine is the kingdom**, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all.

Analysing the Lord's Prayer

Joining with the Father to pray to the Father

Our Father....

➤ Who is our father?

- The Spirit of the Father – Christ
“I and my father are one” John 10:30
- We join with Jesus when we use this prayer

...which art in heaven,

➤ What is heaven?

- Being in the Spirit of God the father – Christ

Hallowed be thy name.

➤ A short prayer of praise

- Holy
- Set apart
- Revered
- Honoured

The First Petition

Thy Kingdom come.

➤ What is the kingdom?

- “Neither shall they say, Lo here! or, lo there! for, behold, the kingdom of God is within you.” Luke 17:21
- When our human spirit and the Spirit of God is put within us, we are then the Kingdom of God

Thy will be done; as in heaven so in earth.

➤ What is his will?

- As all evil and iniquity was expelled from the presence of God – we ask that the same be done in earth (this is also applied to our earthly bodies)

Analysing the Lord's Prayer

The Second Petition

Give us day by day our daily bread.

➤ What is that bread?

- Our spiritual bread – the word of God
- “Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God” Matthew 4:4
- “This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die.” John 6:50
- “I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD:” Amos 8:11

Prayer of Penitence / Commitment

And forgive us our sins; for we also forgive everyone that is indebted to us.

➤ What is forgiveness?

- While we are freely given forgiveness it is our Christian duty to forgive others
- “But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses” Matthew 6:15

Analysing the Lord's Prayer

The Third Petition

And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

- “Be not overcome of evil, **but overcome evil** with good. ” Romans 8:21
- “**Him that overcometh** will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my new name.” Revelations 3:12

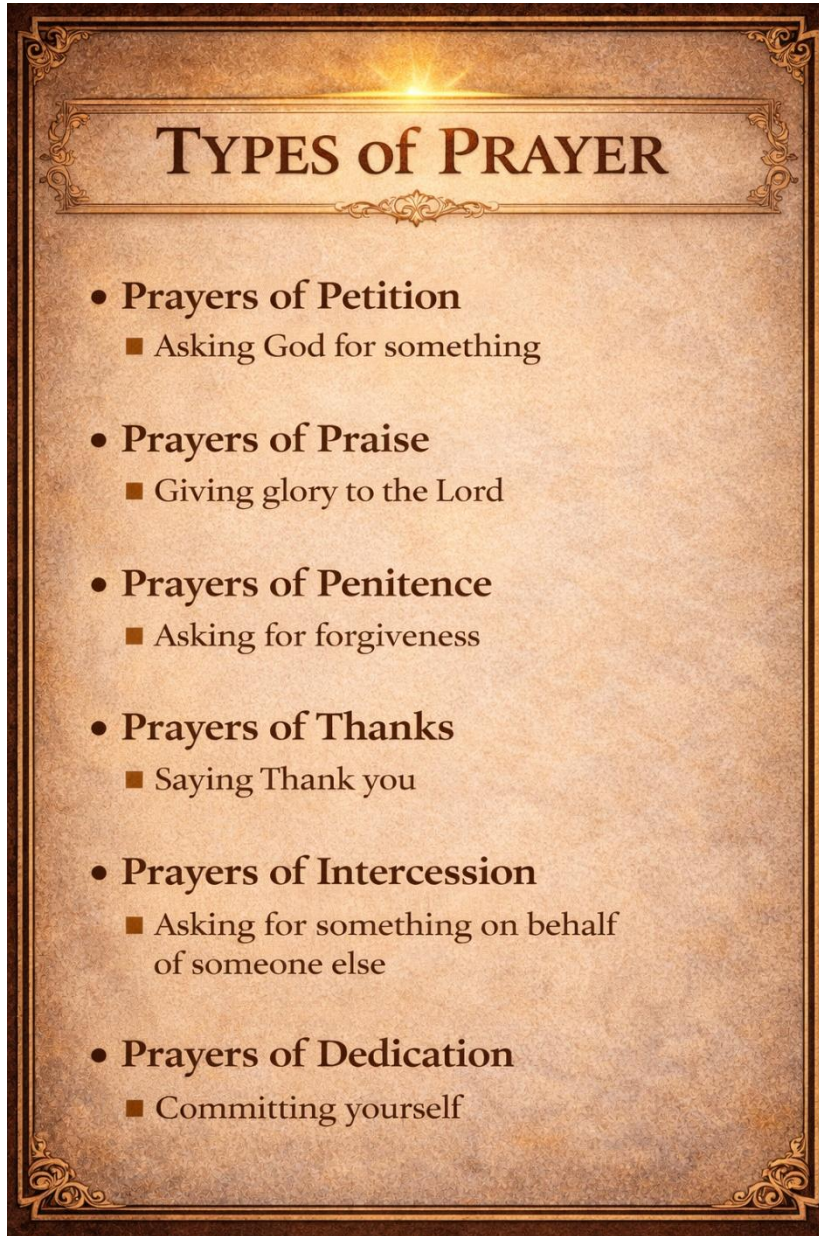
Have we great and sore temptations,

Prayer Points

- Prayer is not a show
 - Matthew 6:5-7, Luke 20:46–47
- Prayer is not just about saying the right words
 - Romans 8:26, Matthew 10:20
- Prayer is not like a vending machine (Luke 22:42, 1 John 5:14)
 - God may say Yes
 - God may say No
 - God may say Not Yet
- Prayer can be dangerous to your complacency or self-conceit
 - Revelation 3:17 (Laodicea)
 - Mark 10:17–22 (the young rich ruler)
- Prayers are compared to offering sweet smelling incense to God
 - Psalm 141:2, Revelation 8:3–4



Prayer Points



- Prayers can be offered in many different ways

- Private prayer

“⁵ And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.

⁶ But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.”

Matthew 6:5,6

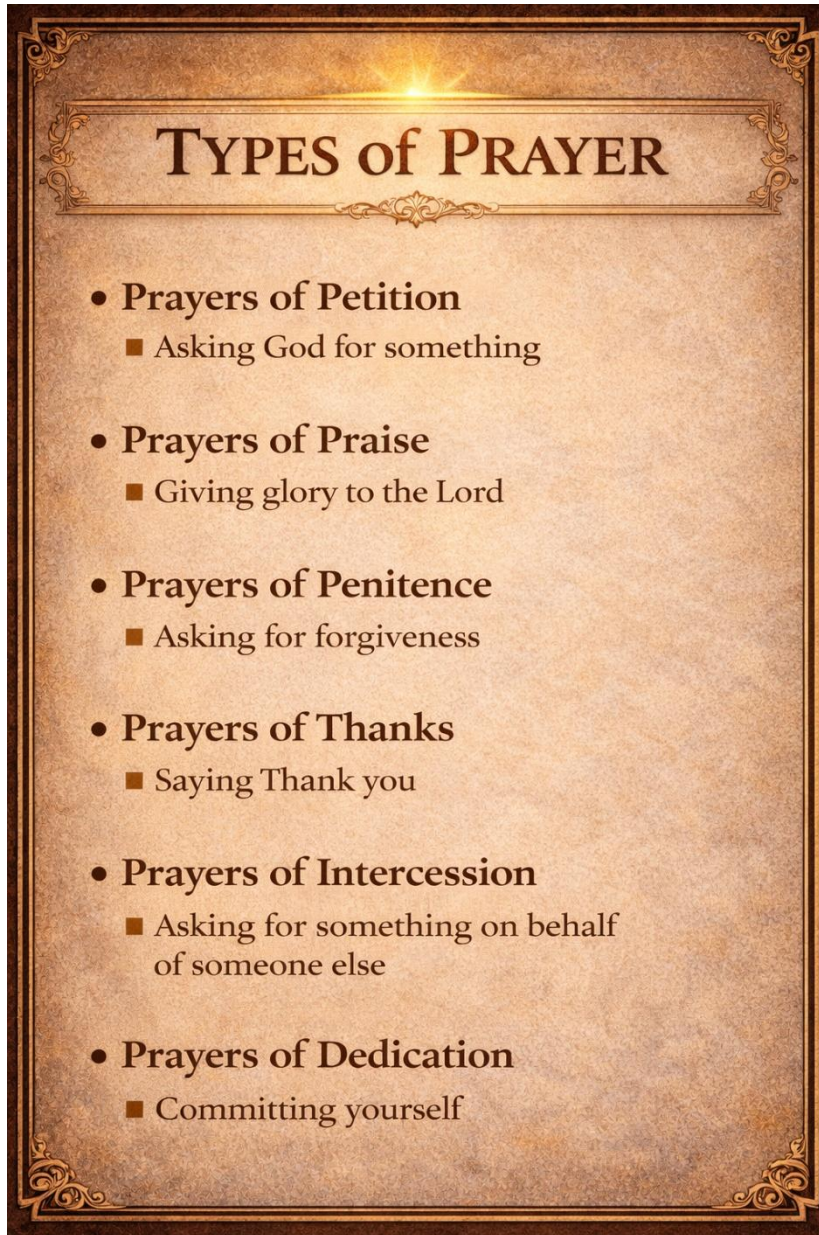
- Jesus’ petition for the cup to pass from him

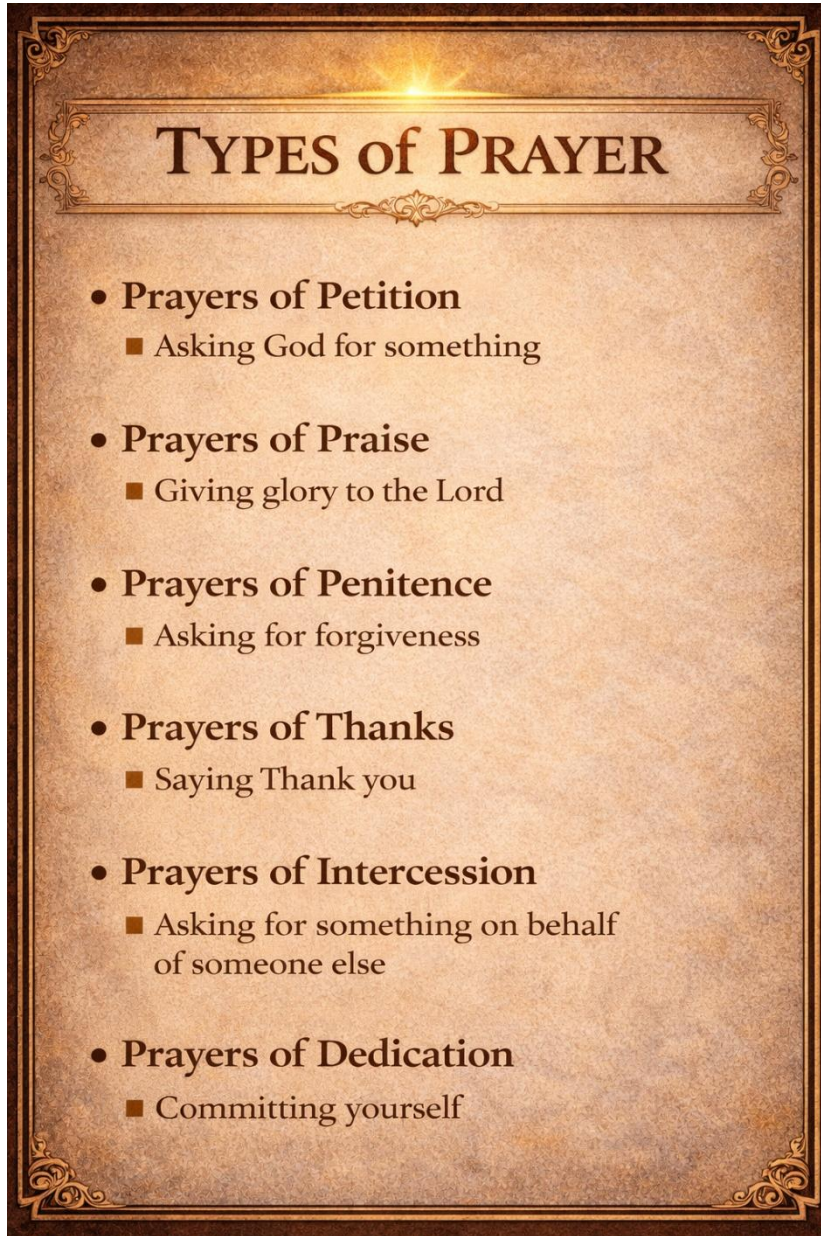

And I knew that thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said it, that they may believe that thou hast sent me.”

2 Chronicles 20

It came to pass after this also, that the children of Moab, and the children of Ammon, and with them other beside the Ammonites, came against Jehoshaphat to battle.

² Then there came some that told Jehoshaphat, saying, There cometh a great multitude against thee from beyond the sea on this side Syria; and, behold, they be in Hazazontamar, which is Engedi.

³ And Jehoshaphat feared, and set himself to seek the LORD, and proclaimed a fast throughout all Judah.

⁴ And Judah gathered themselves together, to ask help of the LORD: even out of all the cities of Judah they came to seek the LORD.

⁵ And Jehoshaphat stood in the congregation of Judah and Jerusalem, in the house of the LORD, before the new court,

⁶ And said, O LORD God of our fathers, art not thou God in heaven? and rulest not thou over all the kingdoms of the heathen? and in thine hand is there not power and might, so that none is able to withstand thee?

⁷ Art not thou our God, who didst drive out the inhabitants of this land before thy people Israel, and gavest it to the seed of Abraham thy friend for ever?

⁸ And they dwelt therein, and have built thee a sanctuary therein for thy name, saying,

⁹ If, when evil cometh upon us, as the sword, judgment, or pestilence, or famine, we stand before this house, and in thy presence, (for thy name is in this house,) and cry unto thee in our affliction, then thou wilt hear and help.

¹⁰ And now, behold, the children of Ammon and Moab and mount Seir, whom thou wouldest not let Israel invade, when they came out of the land of Egypt, but they turned from them, and destroyed them not;

¹¹ Behold, I say, how they reward us, to come to cast us out of thy possession, which thou hast given us to inherit.

¹² O our God, wilt thou not judge them? for we have no might against this great company that cometh against us; neither know we what to do: but our eyes are upon thee.

¹³ And all Judah stood before the LORD, with their little ones, their wives, and their children.

¹⁴ Then upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite of the sons of Asaph, came the Spirit of the LORD in the midst of the congregation;

¹⁵ And he said, Hearken ye, all Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem, and thou king Jehoshaphat, Thus saith the LORD unto you, Be not afraid nor dismayed by reason of this great multitude; for the battle is not yours, but God's.

¹⁶ To morrow go ye down against them: behold, they come up by the cliff of Ziz; and ye shall find them at the end of the brook, before the wilderness of Jeruel.

¹⁷ Ye shall not need to fight in this battle: set yourselves, stand ye still, and see the salvation of the LORD with you, O Judah and Jerusalem: fear not, nor be dismayed; to morrow go out against them: for the LORD will be with you.

¹⁸ And Jehoshaphat bowed his head with his face to the ground: and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem fell before the LORD, worshipping the LORD.

¹⁹ And the Levites, of the children of the Kohathites, and of the children of the Korhites, stood up to praise the LORD God of Israel with a loud voice on high.

²⁰ And they rose early in the morning, and went forth into the wilderness of Tekoa: and as they went forth, Jehoshaphat stood and said, Hear me, O Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem; Believe in the LORD your

God, so shall ye be established; believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper.

²¹ And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed singers unto the LORD, and that should praise the beauty of holiness, as they went out before the army, and to say, Praise the LORD; for his mercy endureth for ever.

²² And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten.

²³ For the children of Ammon and Moab stood up against the inhabitants of mount Seir, utterly to slay and destroy them: and when they had made an end of the inhabitants of Seir, every one helped to destroy another.

²⁴ And when Judah came toward the watch tower in the wilderness, they looked unto the multitude, and, behold,

they were dead bodies fallen to the earth, and none escaped.

²⁵ And when Jehoshaphat and his people came to take away the spoil of them, they found among them in abundance both riches with the dead bodies, and precious jewels, which they stripped off for themselves, more than they could carry away: and they were three days in gathering of the spoil, it was so much.

²⁶ And on the fourth day they assembled themselves in the valley of Berachah; for there they blessed the LORD: therefore the name of the same place was called, The valley of Berachah, unto this day.

²⁷ Then they returned, every man of Judah and Jerusalem, and Jehoshaphat in the forefront of them, to go again to Jerusalem with joy; for the LORD had made them to rejoice over their enemies.

²⁸ And they came to Jerusalem with psalteries and harps and trumpets unto the house of the LORD.

²⁹ And the fear of God was on all the kingdoms of those countries, when they had heard that the LORD fought against the enemies of Israel.

³⁰ So the realm of Jehoshaphat was quiet: for his God gave him rest round about.
